

Carrots	Chantenay** ~ large, broad orange carrots, grows well in clay, good variety for market gardens Danvers Half Long ** ~ 1871, thick, tapered orange roots, grow well in poor soil, grows deeply, good for storage Early Scarlet Horn** ~ 1600's, Dutch Heirloom, good in heavy soils, endangered variety Nantes ~ 1870, France Oxheart** ~ pre-1884, French variety, short, thick root
Celery	Paris Golden Self Blanching** ~ 1886, easy to blanch
Clover	annual, crimson, for cover cropping
Corn	Dwarf Multicoloured ~ size of cobs is small to medium, use for decoration or flour, very early Orchard Baby ~ sweet, date unknown Tom Thumb ~ popcorn
Cosmos	Sensation ~ from seed collected in 2010
Cucumber	Beit Alpha ~ Middle Eastern type, good slicer Improved Long Green ~ 1872, long slicing type, dark green Marketmore

Lettuce	Anuenue ~ French crisp type Black Seeded Simpson ~ 1870's Cimmaron ~ red romaine, 18 th century Merveille des Quatre Saisons aka Continuity ~ pre-1885, French heirloom, butterhead, reddish green Plato ~ green romaine, disease resistant Red Deer Tongue ~ looseleaf, red arrow shaped leaves Reine Des Glaces "Ice Queen" ~ French crisphead type about 200 years old Spotted Allepo ~ pre- 1731, ancient variety, introduced to Europe from Syria in 1700's, spotted romaine Speckled ~ 1799, very old historic heirloom, butterhead Tom Thumb** ~ 1850, dwarf bright green lettuce, butterhead type White Paris Cos

Peas	Little Marvel aka Improved American Wonder** ~ 1900, productive, dwarf bush shelling pea Mammoth Melting Sugar ~ heirloom, large snow pea, climber, productive late into season Tom Thumb** ~ 1800's, early, dwarf shelling pea, historically grown under glass in Calgary
Phacelia	green manure, flowers attract bees
Potatoes	Bintje ~ heirloom, late yellow, storage German Butterball Green Mountain ~ white 1885 Irish Cobbler ~ white 1800's Norland ~ early, red skin and white flesh Russet Burbank (Netted Gem) ~ heirloom, late season, white flesh, storage
Pumpkin	Sugar ~ traditional pie pumpkin
Quinoa	Temuco ~ produces blond seeds, leaves edible, ancient grain of the Incas, self seeded from 2010

Sunflowers	Russian Mammoth ~ pre-1870, Russian origin, seeds used for feed, stalks used for fuel Velvet Queen ~ multi- branching type, burgundy flowers Fort Calgary variety ~ self seeded year after year, multi branching, gold with dark centre
Sweet Peas	Mix
Swiss Chard	Rhubarb ~ red veined variety Flamingo Pink ~ heirloom, pink veins Fordhook Giant ~ white stalks, green crinkled leaves Five Colour Silverbeet ~ 1970, "Rainbow Chard", wide range of coloured stalks, beautiful
Wheat	Hard Red Calcutta Red Fife ~ first grown in Canada in 1843, late Utrecht Blue ~ very decorative, grown in Holland 1900
